The dental care system is arguably the most inequitable part of Australia's health system. And right now there's a real risk that it could get worse.

We need you individually or your organisation help to make sure this doesn't happen.

NOHA will keep you informed about relevant government decisions, NOHA actions and any specific actions that you could take to support our advocacy.

There is no cost but your signature will add weight to NOHA's advocacy, especially if you can convince your organisation to join as well. NOHA is an alliance of health consumer, service provider and professional bodies with a shared view of the importance of better and more equitable oral health services. We will also link you to campaigns run by individual members of the Alliance, such as the Australian Dental Association's campaign to save the Child Dental Benefits Schedule (see below to sign up to it as well).

NOHA is advocating for three outcomes:

- Retention of the Child Dental Benefits Schedule, under which 60% of Australian children are eligible for bulk-billed dental care (and sign up to the ADA Campaign below);
- Expansion of the National Dental Agreement which was previously reducing waiting times significantly for adults in public dental services
- Ensuring that vulnerable Australians receive timely oral health care, especially older people, Indigenous people, and people in rural and remote areas.
